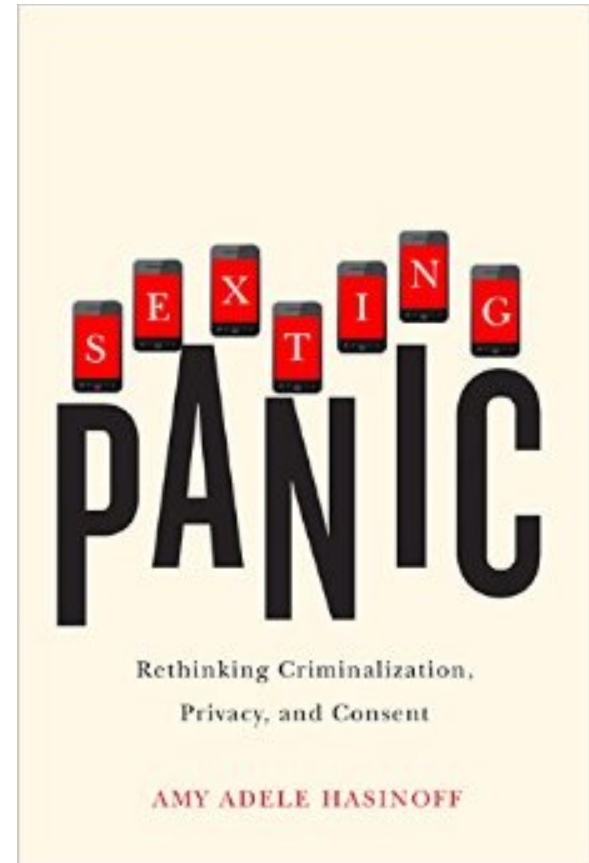
COM 267: New and Converging Media

- Excellent follow up to discussions we've had in COM 160 and COM 265

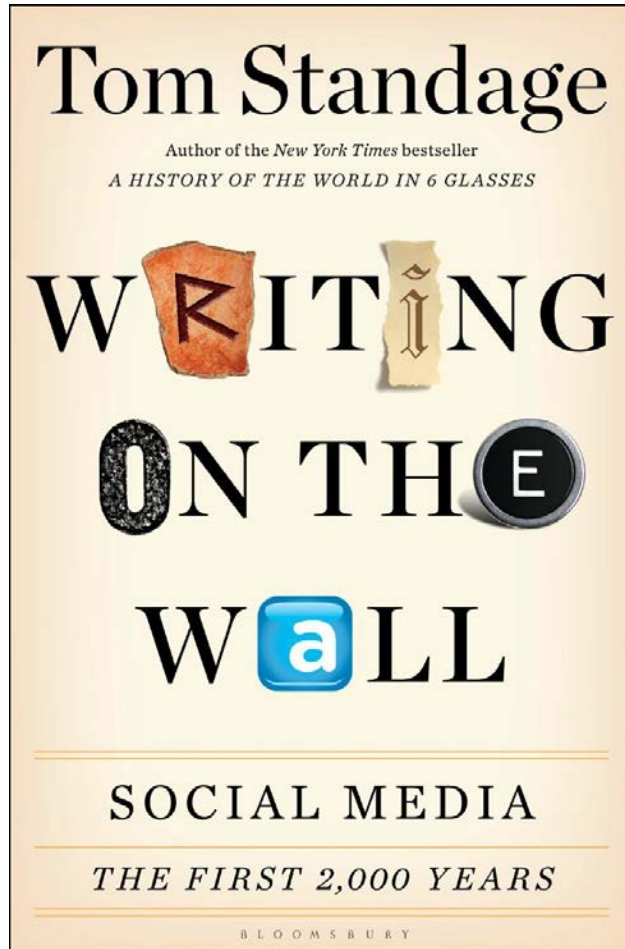

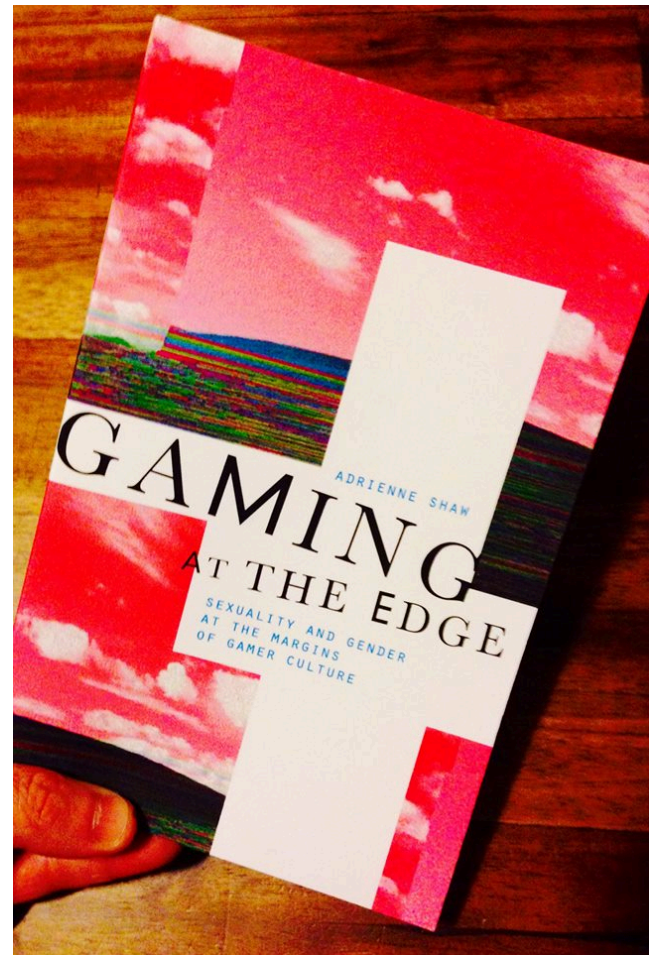
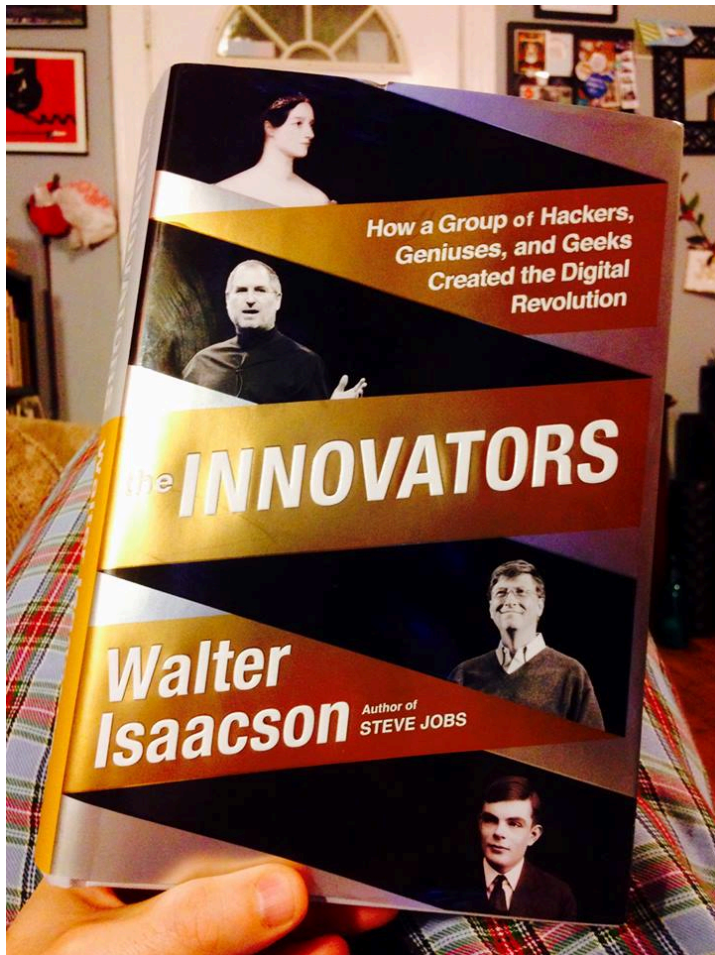


COM 267: New and Converging Media
