Re: Club Sanctions and Requirements

Following an investigation into UNCW Men's Lacrosse activities, the Club has been found responsible for failing to follow policies and procedures relating to previous sanctions and restrictions on Club practices. Specifically, the Club had someone, other than a Competitive Sports Supervisor; provide access to turn on lights to Campus Recreation facilities for practice.

Based on the infractions noted above the members of the Club are assessed the following sanctions:

- Club is prohibited from utilizing locked equipment and lights at the IM Fields, with the exclusion of the home events, effective immediately and expiring January 26, 2012.
- All equipment stored at the IM Fields including but not limited to goals, nets, and other lacrosse equipment will remain stored at this area.
- The Club will lose ten budget points for an intermediate infraction (-3), repeat violation (-5), and negative image (-2).
 - Negative image; (-1) comments made at Sport Club Council Meeting on Tuesday,
 November 8, 2011, (-1) comments made at the Sport Club Travel Meeting on Tuesday,
 November 8, 2011.
- The Club is placed on probation for a period until December 1, 2012, during which any infractions related to the initial incident may result in additional sanctions.

Failure to adhere to the requirements imposed herein will result in the Club being suspended for 30 days and all Club activity, including events, travel, and access to on-campus funds, will be frozen pending further review.

The Club may appeal this decision by submitting in writing a request for an appeal to Mr. Timothy McNeilly, Director of Campus Recreation. The policy as stated in the Sports Club manual is as follows:

Sport Clubs have the opportunity to appeal sanctions imposed by the Sport Club Program and/or Campus Recreation to the Director of Campus Recreation. The club has five business days from the date they are notified of sanctions to provide the Director of Campus Recreation with a formal written notification that they wish to appeal the decision. The offending club should prepare a formal statement of appeal detailing the salient points and counter arguments to be presented to the Director of Campus Recreation. Please note emails and phone messages are not considered formal statements of appeal and will not be accepted by the Director of Campus Recreation.
